# EUROPEAN CLIMATE LEADERSHIP REQUIRES STRONG ENFORCEMENT



The EU's credibility as a global climate champion is **under threat**.

Good legislation is in place – the F-Gas regulation, (EU) 517/2014, aims to reduce HFCs emissions in the EU by 79% by 2030 through a gradual phase down with interim targets – but enforcement across the EU is **uneven** and often **weak**.


## THE RESULT – A THRIVING BLACK MARKET FOR ILLEGALY IMPORTED HFCS

...adding more than **25 million new cars**to EU roads





- Set higher fines
